INTRODUCTION TO STAGE COSTUMING

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon completion of this course the student will develop the following abilities:

1. Design (on paper) a costume for a theatrical production, and execute the design and construction of an appropriate costume item. This would also involve selecting the appropriate fabric and utilizing the appropriate sewing techniques.

As assessed by:

- a. Evaluation of design portfolio by instructor.
- b. Paperwork describing concept and application.
- c. Ongoing progress and evaluation by instructor, and the final sewn product.
- d. Class projects demonstrating sewing skills.

2. Given a particular time period, students will demonstrate knowledge of color theory and how color affects design in an appropriate manner.

As assessed by:

- a. Class projects, renderings and tests.

3. Work cooperatively with the Staff Costume Designer(s) in the Costume Shop, assisting with constructing the costumes for each Main Stage production for that semester.

As assessed by:

- a. 15 hours of lab time working with the above staff.

Upon completion of courses in this department the student will develop the following abilities:

1. Hone performance, design, analytical or technical skills leading to performance in the capacity of at least one of the following: Actor, Director, Stage Manager, Set/Light/ Sound/ Costume/ Make-Up Designer, Stage Technician, Reviewer, Educated Audience Member.
2. Evaluate and appreciate a theatrical performance by recognizing the inherent components that go into creating theatre, including the research involved, the collaboration among designers and director/s, the rehearsal process and the technical skills involved in making a play come to life.
3. Compete for work (in any of the capacities mentioned in outcome #1) in the professional world, as our student theatre environment is highly representative of what occurs in professional theatre. Students will also develop the skills to compete for a place in an institution of higher learning in the relevant field of study.
