

Academic credit is based on a written report or research paper relating to the student's internship experience. Enrollment must be concurrent with an approved internship assignment.
 - COM ST 88A and 88B | Independent Studies
 Conduct independent research on a special study topic related to Communication
 Studies with the approval of the department chair and supervising instructor.
 - SOCIOL 1S | Introduction to Sociology Service Learning
