Associate in Arts for Transfer (AA-T) - Psychology

Many colleges/universities offer bachelor's degrees in this field. Students planning to transfer to a four-year college or university should complete the lower-division major requirements and the general education pattern for the specific transfer institution. SMC has agreements with UC and CSU campuses, as well as several private and out-of-state institutions.

## **Starter Classes**

### PSYCH 1 | General Psychology

This course is an introduction and general survey course in psychology. This course grounds the student in the epistemology of psychology as a scientific discipline, research methods, and critical analysis of research findings.

#### PSYCH 11 | Child and Growth Development

This course will examine the major developmental milestones for children, both typically and atypically developing, from conception through adolescence in the areas of physical, psychosocial, and cognitive development.





# **Program Highlights**

#### Experiential Learning

- PSYCH 8 | Community Psychology
   Community psychology focuses on the application of psychological principles to understand and address community issues. This course requires students to engage in learning outside the classroom in conjunction with various community-based organizations.
- PSYCH 88A and 88B | Independent Studies in Psychology
   Conduct independent research on a special study topic related to Psychology with the approval of the department chair and supervising instructor
- SOCIOL 1S | Introduction to Sociology Service Learning
   Students engage in experiential learning outside of the classroom in conjunction with various community based organizations. Check with the Sociology program (<a href="http://smc.edu/sociology">http://smc.edu/sociology</a>) to see when this course is offered.





# University Research Opportunities

Intro-level social science research and PhD preparation program; 25 community college students in social science related majors are accepted each year; Preference is given to students who are underrepresented within academia (e.g. underrepresented racial/ethnic minorities, former foster youth, formerly incarcerated, veteran, students with a disability, nontraditional age students, etc.); Program runs from November to May, with the opportunity to participate in a summer undergraduate research program.

Scholars receive support through a small research grant, meet and interact with their CC2PhD Graduate Student Mentor and CC2PhD Community College Faculty Advisor, and attend Saturday Academies at UCLA as well as monthly discussion sessions with a CC2PhD Transfer Student Peer Advisor.
